1.B. Annual District Survey Results	<p>Each year, parents are encouraged to participate in the District-wide parent survey. Survey results will be shared during the Annual Title I Parent Involvement Meeting. The 2025 results for William K. Moore Elementary showed mostly positive feedback with areas for improvement. These results are posted on our website and help shape our Parent and Family Engagement Policy.</p> <p>Computers will be available for parents in our office and during evening events throughout the survey period. The survey link will also be posted on our Facebook page and shared by teachers on ClassDojo.</p> <p>Additionally, evaluations are collected after each parent meeting. The feedback from these evaluations is reviewed and used to inform future meeting topics and the development of the family engagement policy.</p>

Moore ES will be invited to several family nights:</p> <p>Parent Engagement Activities Nights; Fall 2025 Winter 2026; Spring 2026 Parent Teacher Conferences; Fall 2025: Winter 2026</p> <p>Multi-Cultural Night: Winter 2025 Math/Science night: Spring 2026</p> <p>During these specific academic nights parents will have the opportunity to be exposed to examples of math and reading grade-level standards, review their child’s current MAP scores and receive resources/make and take activities to assist with helping improve their students' scores.</p> <p>Administration, staff, and teachers answer questions concerning the standards, the school’s curriculum, as well as share data that identify their child’s current progress towards the standards. William K. Moore ES is committed to assisting parents in interpreting the data received from the District and the Nevada Department of Education. Parents are encouraged to use Infinite Campus to monitor their child’s progress throughout the school year.</p>
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<p>4.B Providing Materials and training to parents to improve achievement.</p> <p>NDE Standard 3</p>	<p>Parents will receive materials and ideas to help support their students at scheduled parent meetings and conferences. William K. Moore Elementary, in collaboration with the ELL department, Communities in Schools, the school social worker, and the school counselor, will offer support such as crisis intervention, family counseling, and access to community resources. Teachers and staff will also be trained on strategies and best practices to address students' academic needs to share with families during conferences.</p>
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<p>4.C Building Ties between parents and staff</p> <p>NDE Standard 1</p>	<p>Parents were invited to the "Meet the Teacher" event to get acquainted with the teachers and staff at William K. Moore ES. (Fall 2025) The school counselor in collaboration with the school social worker, and Communities in Schools will continue conducting home visits and provide families with resources such as referrals to counseling, food/bus vouchers, and clothing drives. The school clerk will work with CCSD Truancy department to address attendance and tardiness issues.</p> <p>Based on parent feedback, William K. Moore ES will suggest ways to encourage education at home and provide tips for how parents can help with homework.</p> <p>The school will educate its staff on how to reach out, communicate, and work with parents as equal partners. This will take place at staff meetings, PLC meetings or on staff development days so that our teachers and support professionals can enhance their understanding of and gain strategies for building parent and family relationships.</p>
